

BREAK THE SILENCE ON VIOLENCE

Stand up • Speak out • Intervene

Break the Silence on Violence, a 16 days activism and advocacy campaign conducted by SNEHA, is inspired by a similar international campaign against Gender Violence that was started by the Center for Women's Global Leadership (CWGL) in 1991. The campaign runs from November 25 (International Day against Violence against Women) - to December 10 (International Human Rights Day) - to symbolically link the two and to emphasize that such violence is a violation of human rights.

Our campaign witnessed unprecedented support from Media. The coverage of the event reverberated across newspapers - local, regional and national.

SNEHA actively used tweets (# sneha4action) and other social media formats such as Facebook to garner attention. We were even heard on Radio One from Midday during prime time.

Maternal and Newborn Health is a program designed to influence the government to provide better services for mothers and babies in slum communities. We work with women in Mumbai communities to ensure they access

health care.

Prevention of Violence against Women and Children Program aims to provide crisis intervention to women and children facing violence in their immediate environment. We also work with those who face problems due to their

sexual orientation, disability or occupation.

Child Health and Nutrition Program aims to reduce malnutrition in children in Mumbai slum communities, via the cycle of prevention, early identification and treatment by improving feeding practices of young children amongst mothers and

establishing Day Care Centres where severely malnourished children are treated.

Sexual and Reproductive Health Program aims to empower adolescents and married women in urban slums with the right information and skills that enable them to make informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive health and their family size.

The BMW Guggenheim is a mobile laboratory traveling to cities worldwide. The objective of this lab involved a range of programs on how to make urban environments more responsive to people's needs.

On its Mumbai leg, they collaborated with SNEHA through 'Fresh and Local' an urban farming NGO for the design of a 'Pop Up Garden' - which is a green space that provides privacy, shade and an escape from the city for a community lacking in personal and private green spaces.

The benefits of the garden determined by our community women were: income generation through the production and sale of compost, therapeutic, growing edible herbs and vegetables; providing a safe, private space for emotional and physical recuperation; a teaching space for workshops on healthy eating, nutrition, and gardening, and waste management via composting of kitchen waste from surrounding areas.
